

## **LETTER OF SUPPORT**

Every child is special and unique, but all children need and deserve the same level of health and safety protections while spending time in early care and education settings.

- According to the Alabama Kids Count Data Book, published annually by VOICES for Alabama's Children, since the year 2000 the number of licensed programs in the state has decreased by 60 percent while the number of unregulated and uninspected programs has increased by 40 percent.
- In Alabama, nearly one-half of center-based child care programs are not licensed or inspected by **DHR**, which means they are not required to have meet the Minimum Standards. These include staff criminal background checks, staff-to-child ratios and CPR and First Aid training.
- According to Child Care Aware America, Alabama is 1 of 7 states that allow broad-based exemptions from licensure and inspection for child care programs.
